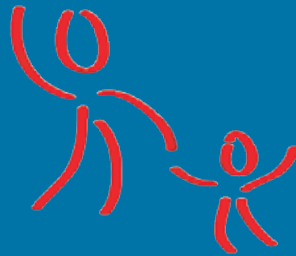

Project Description

In 2003, The Family Resource Facilitation Program was developed to provide additional support to families and staff members at participating child care programs.

Family Resource Facilitators work in partnership with programs to identify and agree upon areas for growth and establish goals. A "Needs Assessment Checklist" is completed by FRFP and the Program to help identify which areas may be in need of additional support. Some areas that might be identified are: staff/child interactions, building partnerships with families, play spaces, supervision, screening children, connecting to the community, basic needs for families, child development, program planning etc.
